"This is my beloved Son, with him I am well pleased." What greater praise could a father speak to his child! I am well pleased with you...


By the way you live...

## **Liturgical Jottings**

The preface for the Baptism of Jesus reads: "It is our duty ... to give you thanks, almighty and eternal God, for in the waters of the Jordan you have revealed with signs and wonders a new Baptism." This new Baptism is vital to the life of our faith community because every Baptism that takes place in our community is a renewal of faith in the Word of God living amongst us. That is why all present at each and every baptism are asked to express their faith in the almighty and eternal God.

## On the Lighter Side

Today we read in the passage from Isaiah: "Let every cliff become a plain." It comes after weeks of frenzied discussion about America's fiscal cliff. Let us hope, for the sake of peace, that this cliff duly becomes a fiscal plain.

## Looking at the Readings

The people from our diocese who went on the pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2012 were moved by the experience of renewing their baptismal vows in the water of the Jordan River. Some immersed themselves in the water; others were sprinkled with water.

There are some remarkable convergences in their story. First there is the continuity between the water in which Jesus was baptised, the water that flows in the Jordan today and the water with which we are baptised. Somehow this makes the self-gift of God in Jesus more real to us, as close to our daily lives as water itself.

More important, however, is that the transformation that took place in the life of Jesus as the result of his baptism by his relative John is the same in essence as the transformation that took place in our lives at Baptism. Basically we are affirmed by Baptism as sons and daughters of God and affirmed in our calling to live as sons and daughters of God. The Gospel reading today makes it clear that Jesus was baptised with water and the Holy Spirit and that is also true for us.

It is interesting to reflect on the role of John the Baptist in the unfolding of this mystery. His relationship with Jesus really began when Mary visited Elizabeth during their pregnancies so John was the ideal person to play the role of precursor. His part in preparing the way for the public ministry of Jesus is so critical that he is sometimes referred to as the last and greatest of the prophets. While this is a good and true depiction of his ministry it is also true that his ministry continues on. Each one of us is invited to continue preparing the way of the Lord.

The full meaning of the ritual carried out by John the Baptist is affirmed by the final line of today's gospel reading when a voice from heaven is heard to say, "You are my Son, the Beloved. My favour rests on you."

# Why did Jesus Choose to be baptized?

Why did Jesus choose to be baptized by John? One answer we might give lies in the revelation of divine humility. The Son of God not only washed the feet of sinners, he allowed himself to be numbered with them. It is significant that here, at the beginning of Christ's ministry, the revelation of his divine sonship is also the revelation of the Father and the Holy Spirit.

'There is a gentle approval in the tender words of the Father and the presence of the Spirit in the form of a graceful dove, as the Son of God submits to baptism with a loving humility. The Christmas season began with the Incarnation which shows God's love for our humanity. It ends with the feast of Christ's baptism in which Christ publicly identifies with sinners to the approval of Father and Spirit. He will keep company with sinners to the very end of his life on the cross.'
