I know, Lord, that you love me. With all my frailties, my weaknesses, my thoughtlessness ... you love me. Help me to love – with no conditions attached.

Overflowing with love......

This parable, traditionally known as the Parable of the Prodigal Son, is really about three characters. We can all identify with one of them. Many of us can identify with the younger brother. Many of us can identify with the older brother. Most of us can identify with both. Calling this gem of a story 'The Parable of the Prodigal Son' only emphasises the first half of the parable. It is as much about a compassionate father and an angry brother as it is about a wasteful son.

Highlighted in this story are two very different ways of receiving the 'lost'. What does it mean to be 'lost'? What does it mean to be 'found'? For one son in the story being found means his father goes running to meet him. He hugs him. He kisses him. "My son who was lost is found! Get him cleaned up and dressed up! Stop working! Stop everything! We're having a party!" This is how it is, when the lost return to God. Do we have two lost people in this parable? Do we finally end up with two found people — or only one? These are the questions we, as Christians really should ask ourselves. All of us need to return home. We need to claim the identity God has for us.

Can we identify with the 'father' in this story, the one who is always watching the horizon for our return? Our prodigal sisters, our prodigal brothers are out there on the road home. Let's get up and run to meet them. Let's have a party ready for them.

Liturgical Jottings

The Season Lent is the most appropriate time for celebrating the sacrament of penance. Already on Ash Wednesday the people of God hear the solemn invitation, "Turn away from sin and believe the good news" It is therefore fitting to have several penitential services during Lent, so that all the faithful may have an opportunity to be reconciled with God and their neighbour and so be able to celebrate the paschal mystery in the Easter Triduum with renewed hearts (Rite of Penance 13).



Prayer for the week

Compassionate God, you know our failings, and yet you rejoice in our homecoming. Encourage us to be ministers of reconciliation and instruments of peace in our world.

Looking at the Readings

We are no doubt familiar with this parable of the Prodigal Son and its story that concludes with his joyful return to his father. However, today's Gospel provides further information regarding the ripple effects this return had upon the other key member of that family - the faithful brother - the brother who 'toiled like a slave' for his father 'never disobeyed' and never asked for reward. He was shocked and angry at the lavish outpouring of attention and expense upon the prodigal. This to him was both unwarranted and unfair when measured against his own behaviour and treatment. No doubt about it; this faithful son thought he deserved better! Perhaps we can relate to his feelings when we recall feeling treated unfairly and someone we consider less favourable is praised ahead of us.

It is worth considering the father's actions in all this. Does he love the 'faithful' son any less? It would appear not as he declares his love and that 'all he has is his'. Is it within the father's nature to have stopped loving the prodigal because of his actions (something his brother seems to have achieved)? It is the father's love that drives his actions and forgiveness not any sense of 'fair play' – no that is not the measure of this father. When the faithful son refuses to go into the feast, still true to his nature, the father patiently waits for this son to come 'home' to him in love.

God the Father waits patiently for us to join him not as a prodigal, or as an aggrieved but obedient slave, but in loving relationship as his child.
