

## 'It is the Lord.' .....

On the joyful recognition of the Risen Lord by the Apostles Peter's impulsive nature is once more to the fore. He jumps out of the boat and heads for shore leaving the others to bring the boat and their catch in. A meal awaits then that question. 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' Pause a moment. There is something great stirring here. Have you ever uttered those words to another? 'Do you love me?' Most of us, once beyond childhood, are terrified at the thought of asking such a question. It is hard enough for some to tell their loved ones of their love for them. But it can be excruciating to ask, 'Do you love me?' Could we ask a friend as much? A brother or sister?

There are scores of questions Christ might have put to Peter. Questions we might have asked such as: Do you promise never to betray me again? Will you finally be more modest in your claims? Do you now, at long last, modify your responses? Can you please be less impulsive? Now do you see why I had to wash your feet? Well, big-mouth? But none of this. Jesus is interested in one thing, the heart of the one before him. The gift of a person even tarnished. The human 'yes' spoken in all its hurt and frailty. Jesus said only, 'Do you love me?' What incredible Love came to live and die in Jesus Christ? What wonderful manner of man was he? How could we not wonder at such a God?

### THE DIFFICULTY OF RECONCILIATION

'Few, if any, escape the experience of being hurt, of being let down by someone we trusted, even loved. And we are all familiar with our natural reaction to that experience - anger, abuse, followed by that ultimate form of human disapproval - no speaks! And we all know, too, how difficult it is to make up when this happens.

'This is Peter's first encounter with the Risen Christ. He must have vivid memories of recent events - his protestation of undying love and loyalty -[Mat 26:35] Peter said to him, "Even though I must die with you, I will not deny you." After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter, "Certainly you are also one of them, for your accent betrays you." [Mat 26:74] Then he began to curse, and he swore an oath, "I do not know the man!"

'Now look at the reaction of Jesus – no reproaches, no reprimands, no "I told you so", no harsh judgements, no warnings about "if you do this again", no bawling out. All Jesus asks for is a reaffirmation of Peter's love. Total generosity and magnanimity of spirit! There are, in life, situations that are irreparable; but, they are few. For the most part, there are many relationships that are broken and could be repaired with a little effort on both sides.'



## **Extraordinary catch of fish**

The miraculous catch of fish has posed a mystery greater than the miracle itself. Why 153 fish? Numbers in Scripture are often symbolic, yet no spiritual match has satisfactorily explained this number. St Jerome, the 5<sup>th</sup> century biblical translator, hazarded that it was the known number of species of fish, indicating that all tribes and nations are represented in the net. Another theory is that 153, being an arithmetic progression of the numbers one to nineteen, indicate that the evangelising ministry of the apostles progressively increased with each person won for Christ.

## Looking at the Readings

In their teaching and preaching the apostles moved from one understanding of God's presence and activity in the midst of the people to another. This new understanding had the death and resurrection of Jesus at its core. The light of the resurrection illumined their former religious convictions and aspirations, and they were undeterred in their commitment to spread this good news, this new word, this transforming light.

A martyr is a witness, who is so committed and willing to suffer any consequence, even death, in order to be faithful. The apostles rejoiced that they had been found worthy of ill-treatment for the sake of the name of Jesus. The Lamb who is exalted is the one who was slain, and Peter is told that, like his master, he will pay for his commitment with his life. Even the psalm alludes to the suffering that must be endured by those who have chosen to be faithful. This kind of steadfastness has always been a persuasive witness.

The days between Easter and Pentecost are set aside for mystagogy, a time for rejoicing in the Resurrection of the Lord and more deeply appreciating the effects of our baptism, confirmation and Eucharist.
