In September this year a group of 2 staff members from St. Augustine's College and 5 parishioners from Kyabram and Tatura will be travelling to the village of Aileu in East Timor.

Chantelle Webb (Social Justice co-ordinator) and Paul Parry (College Chaplain) have been in East Timor during the holidays arranging "The Immersion" and researching projects we can become involved in. The main aim is to spend time in schools with a long term commitment to educational projects.

Chantelle has visited East Timor before and has established a partnership with Sr. Mary-Anne Dwyer (a Mercy Sister from Ballarat) who has been working with the Timor Leste Committee to provide direction about developing sustainable partnerships with the local people.

This is an exciting initiative and we hope it will make a difference to both the people in East Timor and our parishes. We will provide more information when Chantelle and Paul have returned.

The One Who Cares for Us......

Loneliness is one of the commonplace realities of modern, industrialised society. We all know what it's like to feel lonely, anxious and insecure. We spend our lives surrounded by other people but so many believe, in their heart of hearts, that they are alone. Yet, we are not alone. Often there are neighbours who do stand ready to step up and help. More importantly, our Lord Jesus Christ promises he will never leave us alone. Today Jesus sketches out for us the extent of his caring. He does this by means of a humble, homely parable in which he describes the intimate relationship between a good shepherd and his sheep. This was typical of the Middle Eastern shepherd in biblical times. Instead of cowering alone on a hillside, at the mercy of harsh weather or wild beasts, the sheep have a shepherd to guide them, shelter and protect them. It is a very special relationship, close and intimate in ways that are hard for us to imagine. The sheep recognise their shepherd's voice. He leads by walking ahead of them; trusting their shepherd implicitly, the sheep follow. They will never be left alone, because they have their shepherd to guide and look after them as we are never left alone with Jesus as our good Shepherd. The way we most clearly find Christ is in serving others. If you find that you are lonely reach out to someone who is alone or in need. The cure to loneliness is giving of ourselves, as Jesus, the Good Shepherd, gave himself for us. In the love of Christ, we are never alone and nothing can interfere with Jesus' care for us; we are secure in his hands.

Liturgical Jottings

This Sunday is traditionally referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. The Gospel for each of the Sundays in Years A, B & C comes from John chapter 10: The Good Shepherd. Year C has the finale expressing the relationship between shepherd and sheep and between Christ and the Father. Four verbs highlight the "Listen", "Know". relationship: "Follow" and "Live". It concludes with a promise that "they [God's people] will never be lost."



Prayer for the week

Cry out with joy to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness. Come before him singing for joy. We are his people, the sheep of his flock. Know that he, the Lord, is God. (Psalm 99)

Looking at the Readings

Unity in diversity is first found in the divine union of the Trinity. All other models of unity flow from it. Both the first and the second readings depict communities made up of people from every nation, race, people and tongue, Jews and Gentile alike. This is precisely the makeup of most communities today. Parishes and religious groups that were born with a particular cultural identity have changed in complexion and composition. Despite the obvious differences, all are children of the one God, all are ioined in their common confession of faith.

Not everyone is happy with diversity. Some within the early community resented the success of Paul and Barnabas and they tried to turn the people against them. This sounds strangely familiar to us. Religious groups born out of struggle and hard work, that were lovingly nurtured and that grew strong, often resist what they perceived to be the invasion of foreigners. If these people could only take as their model the company of the blessed revealed in John's vision, they would see that those who have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb come from every nation and race and people and tongue. © Dianne Bergant CSS
