- Microphone should be adjusted to suit you before Mass
- Microphone should be between you and what you are reading
- You must speak louder than normal speaking voice, also clearer and slower. If it sounds strange then you are probably doing the right thing and reading well.
- Once you introduce the reading, sit nearby.
- Take your time to walk back to the microphone. (This gives the congregation time to absorb what they have heard).
- Hopefully the congregation will <u>wait</u> for you to ask them to stand for the Alleluia Verse.

• Wait till the commentator has told you to stand for the Alleluia Verse. Take your time to be nourished by the Word of God.

Real Peace.....

Today we are listening in to Jesus comforting, encouraging and blessing us, offering us a gift beyond anything we can imagine —his risen presence as the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. 

Looking at the Readings

The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

God the Father attested that Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit at the time of his Baptism. Therefore, Jesus, in turn, hands on to his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit: "The Father will send the Paraclete who will teach you everything". The Paraclete, dwelling within the disciples, will mediate a continuing presence of Jesus in the time-gap before the final coming of Jesus.

Peace is his final gift to them, a peace the world cannot give. The Hebrew word for peace, *shalom*, conveys more than our word peace. In general it conveys a sense of universal completeness where nothing is lacking, a state of well-being belonging to God. When one possesses peace, one is in perfect communion with God.

The Christian has a vocation to peace. True peace is based on righteousness and justice.

Memorial of the week: Julian of Norwich

Little is know of her except for her writings (Revelations of Divine Love) and that she lived from 1342-1430 as a recluse in turbulent years both for the Church, torn by the papal schism and for the life of the people who were suffering a long war between the England and France and also from the great plague. Never canonised she is greatly honoured for her mystical writings. Pope Benedict XVI wrote of her: "God, however, even in periods of tribulation, does not cease to inspire figures such as Julian of Norwich, to recall people to peace, love and joy." She is remembered on the 8th or 13th May.
