'....according to your word'

In Mary's experience, she is afraid but chooses to trust God - she doesn't walk away. She and God together are creating. God chooses to come into the world through Mary. God chooses to need her help. Mary, for her part chooses to allow God to use her. This is what we are called to do as well.

Roland Rolheiser, in his book The Holy Longing, talks about how the Incarnation was not a 33 year event that took place 2000 years ago. It is an ongoing mystery that we are called to participate in as Christians. In a very real way, we are called to put 'skin' to our prayers of 'Your will be done.' We are called to be the comforter to the dying, the support for the lonely and lover of the hated.

Outlined in the Scriptures we see how Mary responds to God as she prays. First Mary *listens* to what is being asked, then *questions* the situation. After *pondering* the situation, Mary then *makes a decision*. Perhaps we could use this model when making a big decision!

So today, as we approach the celebration of Christ's coming into our world, could we consider how can we, right now, bring Christ to the world in whatever we are doing? How are we, like Mary, called to co-create with God and bring Christ to the world? May we let the Holy Spirit come upon us and the power of the Most High overshadow us and empower us to be Christ's body here on earth.

Looking back at 2014

Together we have achieved much during 2014. Reflecting on just some of our achievements. I can remember that we:

- Held a school/parish fete which raised approx. \$17,000
- Enjoyed a wonderful fundraising pasta night at the Italian Club \$3,785 (+ Donation from St Donato C'tee \$2,000)
- Combined with St Augustine's for the Bunnings BBQ and raised \$1,485
- Some of our parishioners experienced the Timor Leste Immersion again this year
- Painted the interior of the Church
- Almost completed plumbing restoration work on the convent and Parish Hall
- Participated in a Parish Planned Giving Campaign to carry us over the next three years
- Participated in a pilot program to change and upgrade our Parish/Diocese computer system
- The CWL continued to cater for our funerals
- Enjoyed many "cuppa after Mass" Sundays (yum!!)
- With Bishop Leslie in August we celebrated First Eucharist/Confirmations
- Many of our children made their First Reconciliation
- Celebrated beautiful Sunday Children's Liturgies
- Appointed an new Deputy Principal for Sacred Heart and Principal for St Augustine's for 2015
- Assisted many, many families through the good works of St Vincent de Paul
- Raised approx. \$85,000 at the "Vinnies" shop
- Established Mini-Vinnies (35 members) at Sacred Heart School (They raised \$700 through the year and sponsored 4 overseas children for education, sent "teddies" to Kenya and bought 13 Christmas gifts for SVDP hampers!)
- Assisted many families with pastoral care meals/packs
- Celebrated Mass (or Liturgy of the Word with Communion) every Friday at Dhurringile Prison
- Had pastoral involvement each week through our Chaplains at Dhurringile Prison
- Brought prisoners to Mass by bus at least once a month
- Celebrated baptisms, weddings and the lives of some of our parishioners at funerals
- I went as Chaplain with 12 teachers to Cebu in the Philippines

If I have forgotten anything or anyone/group I am sorry, but as I began thinking the list just tumbled on to the paper.

It is not until you sit down and think about what has happened during the year that it becomes clear that we have a vibrant and enthusiastic band of dedicated parishioners. When I visit the school on Fridays for assembly I see the future, but when I come to Mass on Sundays I see the present – a community of faith coming together as friends sharing in the same love of God and professing the same Catholic faith as our forebears whose vision and generosity laid the foundation for Sacred Heart. Let us continue to come together in faith, love and support of each other during the New Year of 2015.

Looking at the Readings

The reading today from the Gospel according to Luke tells the story of the Annunciation. It begins with the words, "The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth." From that moment this small, insignificant town on the edge of the Roman Empire became a significant site in the unfolding of the story of salvation.

On arrival the angel greeted Mary with the words, "Rejoice so highly favoured! The Lord is with you." Not surprisingly Mary wondered what this could possibly mean. She had probably never thought of herself as being in any way different from the other young people in her home town.

The angel then briefly explains to her that she will conceive and bear a son whom she is to name Jesus. He will also be called the Son of the Most High. Mary is even more deeply puzzled by how this can possibly happen because she is a virgin.

Again the angel has an answer; but it is one that draws Mary even more deeply into the unfolding of the mystery of salvation. "The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the most high will cover you with its shadow and so your son will be holy and will become the Son of God."

To this Mary answered, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me." These inspiring words of consent to the will of God for her brings the time of preparation for the long awaited Messiah to an end. God's own Son, the Messiah, has been with us from the time Mary conceived.

Those words of Mary, spoken so long ago in a culture very different from our own, still touch each and every one of us personally. Her acceptance of God's will for her in so far as she understood it is an example to every person of faith. More than that. It is our point of entry into the all embracing grace of salvation.
