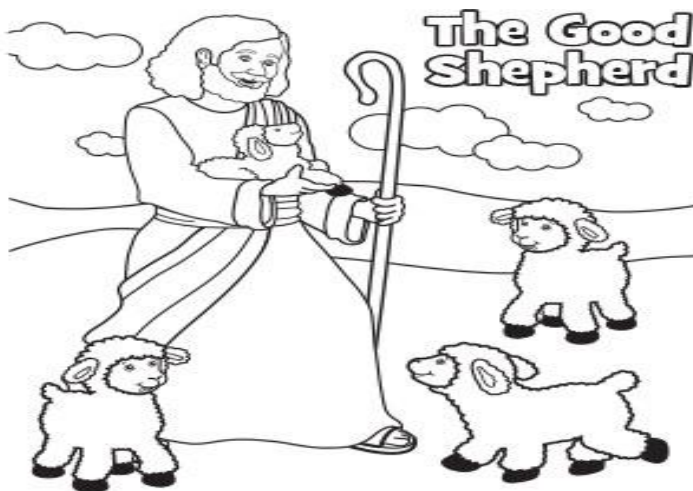
We raised \$346.50 on Sea Sunday for our seafarers.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

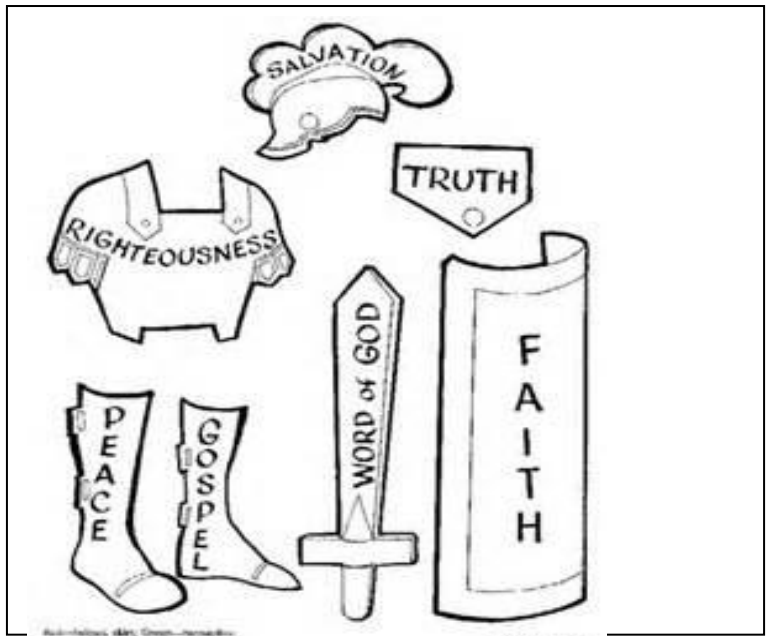
"...come away by yourselves to a lonely place and rest awhile." (Mark 6:31)

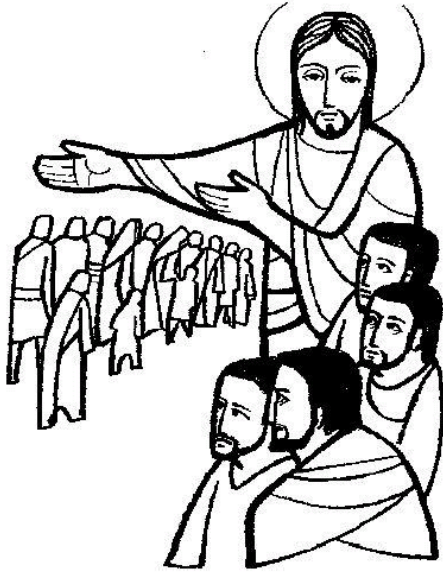

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Focus on the Gospel

This week we celebrated the Memorial of Mary Magdalene (22 July). I have always been fond of the woman from Magdala; I have always thought her an underrated and noble disciple, given bad press and a mistaken identity. Despite what is often said Mary was not a prostitute, nor was she the woman who washed Jesus' feet with her hair at Bethany. She did have demons driven out of her by Jesus, which led her to become a follower of Jesus, a disciple, and financial supporter of Jesus' ministry.

It was to Mary that Jesus first appeared after his resurrection sending her out to tell the others of the Resurrection, hence her title of Apostle to the Apostles. Mary was the first one to experience the absolute joy of seeing the risen Jesus and also the total pain of not being able to touch him. Mary was the first to know what it was to love Jesus without being able to physically touch him. For her, here was the truth of the resurrection, that the joy of the experiencing Jesus in one's life is also accompanied by the realisation that until death it will always be faith that brings Jesus to us and not physicality.

It was after Jesus' death that Mary came into her own. The Eastern Orthodox Church holds Mary in high esteem as a wisdom figure. There is a large stele dedicated to her work and wisdom in Ephesus. But for me I think Mary is an enduring figure, who exists and persists because she believed in Jesus and followed him to the end. She flouted convention, and she is often the figure held up as the opposite of the purity of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Mary of Magdala was the baddy that the early Church had to have. She was an independent woman of means, who needed no man to direct her life. She supported the male mission, without needing to be in the front. She was the choice of Jesus for revelation. She followed courageously, despite ridicule and threat, and stayed to the end. She had experienced the healing power of Jesus and needed no more proof of his glory.

I truly like this woman of Magdala, and next Wednesday is the day held by the church as her memorial, and there is a lot to remember.

Year of Consecrated Life

Christian Brothers

The Brothers are worldwide community founded by Blessed Edmund Rice with the chief ministries of evangelisation and education of young people, especially the poor.
