WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

Mental Health begins with me!

World Mental Health Day (WMHD) is a day for global mental health education, awareness and advocacy. It is an initiative of the World Federation for Mental Health. WMHD is an annual program held on 10 October to raise public awareness of mental health issues world wide.

This year, the theme is – Mental Health begins with me! The theme aims to encourage people to personal ownership of their mental health and well-being.

One in five Australians will experience mental illness this year. We all have a role to play in looking after our own mental health and well-being.

When our parishes gather, nearly everyone will know someone who has a mental illness of varying severity and length. Because of the stigma attached to it, few will come forward, but it is there. How can we support people living with the stigma of mental illness?

People living with mental health challenges, are no less members of the Body of Christ than anyone else. People with mental illness and their families often feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. Isolation is often caused by social stigma: the idea that mental illness is a question of character or a punishment from God.

As a faith community, we can offer spiritual comfort through our prayerful presence in people's lives by acknowledging their pain and supporting them through the healing and recovery process.

Everyone can take part in looking after their own well-being and good health, which is important to everyone. It is a reminder to look after our own well-being, especially our spiritual well-being.

The young man is a good man who is wealthy. In his community wealth was a sign of great favour from God. However he would have been expected to share his wealth for the good of the poor.

The Ten Commandments are part of the Torah or Law, the Jews derived 613 laws from these commandments. The young man keeps all these commandments but Jesus asks for more than merely keeping the commandments but to sell up all he possess and give the money to the poor. For Jesus you must put God first. Possessions or attachments are distractions or stumbling blocks to keeping one's mind on the goal of eternal life.

Salvation is a free gift from God, not something you personally earn. Jesus is challenging us to risk all and give all in following him wholeheartedly. The young man treats salvation like a commodity he can buy. Like a monk called Pelagius he is seeking salvation without the need for Jesus. Jesus calls us to put our relationship with him first and then all other things will fall into place.

Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him. Put yourself in the place of the young man. Feel Jesus look at you and know that he loves you. Bask in that for some time. Then look at your life and make your focus Jesus first and everything else second. What are you prepared to leave behind to follow Jesus? What attachments are holding you back from following Jesus wholeheartedly?
