Looking at the Readings

You may be familiar with the “Six degrees of separation”. It is a theory that everyone and everything is six or fewer steps away, by way of introduction, from any other person in the world, so that a chain of “a friend of a friend statements can be made to connect any two people in a maximum of six steps. It was originally set out by Frigyes Karinthy in 1929. In the current world of social media it has a significant place when one is trying to demonstrate our importance and celebrity. Today it is to have a ‘selfie’ with a celebrity and in past times to meet or even see royalty. This activity in no way reflects on our importance or merit. Imagine, however, if the royalty seeks us out and the roles were reversed?

Each of us is blessed to be only one degree of separation from the King of all kings. He is directly accessible to each of us and has promised to be ‘with us always’. He is as close as our next thought, next breath and next prayer. He does not stand on ceremony or have a long arrangement of protocols to follow. Jesus is truly a king as the final prayer of our Eucharist declares “Through Him, and with Him and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, forever and ever.” Through all of Creation Jesus, the King of the Universe, gives glory to the Father.

Jesus does not exercise his reign through the power of ownership and domination. He has demonstrated in his life his rule of love. An unconditional love for everyone not reserved to those within ‘six degrees’ or who had earned it. This feast of Christ the King offers us the opportunity to honour our King of hearts, and ensure that our own heart is open and welcoming to his royal presence.

Who or what rules our heart? What motivates us, drives us along in life? Who do we make time for? “The quality of a person can be measured only by the quality of his or her heart.” (Christopher Gleeson SJ)
