COMPANION TO THE DYING

We have been having some talks around the diocese this year but not in the Goulburn Valley. I approached Lyn Breen and she then spoke to Loretta Lilford and Sr Helen Glasheen who run these very informal discussions on accompanying the dying.

It was well responded to with approximately 35 in attendance. There was only three men in the group. So I am not sure what that is saying of interest in the topic.

Sister Helen spoke of the work with palliative care and Loretta spoke on her wealth of experience with 37 years of nursing and much of that time in district nursing. She certainly left no one in doubt of their own ability to walk the journey with the dying.

Because sometimes it only means sitting, listening, just being there. It will require listening to what is not being said.

She had some very helpful handouts with forms to fill in that we need to have in place that will help doctors, family etc understand what we request when communication is not possible.

Those participating shared their experiences which created good discussion and learning moments. I shared how helpful was the palm cross. This cross gives so much comfort to the sick and dying. It fits so snugly in your hands, some leave it under their pillow. It is nice to be able to leave one with a person even as a gift. Let it tell it's own story.

Loretta left us with two questions, "Am I comfortable with my life, with what I have achieved and done?" "Is there anything I need to do in readiness for dying?"

I am sure everyone has taken away with them something that will help them in the future when faced with the question of dying of others or self.



Liturgical Jottings Homily II

Through the course of the liturgical year the homily sets forth the mysteries of faith and the standards of the Christian life ... The purpose of the homily at Mass is that the spoken word of God and the liturgy of the Eucharist may together become "a proclamation of God's wonderful works in the history of salvation, the mystery of Christ". ... It must always lead the community of the faithful to celebrate the Eucharist actively, "so that they may hold fast in their lives to what they have grasped by faith". ... The homily must be truly the fruit of meditation, carefully prepared, neither too long nor too short and suited to all those present, even children.

Focus on the Readings

The question of legitimacy of ministry is not a new one. There is a certain amount of tension between the institutional and the charismatic aspects of the church. To say that one is Spirit-driven and the other is not is to misunderstand Jesus' promise to remain with the church until the end of time. God normally calls ministers through the structures of the community. The authorities of the church are usually the ones who make the ultimate decisions about the needs of the church, how these needs are to be met, and who is to meet them. That is one of the responsibilities of their office.

However, God calls in other ways as well. A solid biblical tradition maintains that the Spirit is not confined to human structure or custom. We see this in the judges, the prophets, and even the early kings. The Pentecost story describes the coming of the Spirit upon all people – sons and daughters, young and old, slaves and free. When God calls it is up to us to recognise that call and to test its spirit. Perhaps the primary criterion we have for judging is the biblical measure: By their fruits you shall know them.

Today we also see that those who benefit from exploitation of the vulnerable will reap the fruits of their sin. This warning stems from the belief in the justice of God. Just as we believe that God will not allow the righteous to go unrewarded, so we are confident that neither will the wicked escape punishment. © Dianne Bergant CS.
