PRAYER



DIOCESE OF SANDHURST Report on the first stage of the Council. The following is taken from the 1st stage of the report.

Participation in this first stage of the Plenary Council appears to have been a generally positive experience for many people, drawing people together in an atmosphere of welcome and inclusiveness. What participants appear to have enjoyed was the opportunity to dialogue, to express their own opinions and to hear the opinions of others. It is clear that a significant number of participants saw the exercise as worthwhile and positive.

At the same time, several issues of concern have emerged about the implementation of this first phase of the Council in our Diocese. It may be that these concerns emerged in other rural Dioceses as well. Some of these concerns include the following:

□ The dialogue dynamic in which persons and groups came together to prayerfully discern and discuss issues, rather than make an individual submission, does not appear to have been as widespread as we hoped.

Issues of passivity and disillusionment about the state of Catholicism and the value of such a Plenary meeting may well have effected willingness to be involved.

□ As a rural Diocese, with the furtherest some 5 hours from Bendigo, distance and isolation of communities may well have impacted on the willingness and ability of people to be involved.

□ There is concern about how accurately the results submitted for this Diocese may represent such groups as the youth, the non-churched, ethnic groups, and persons in special circumstances (eg. Prisons).

Our general impression is that the invitation via the Plenary Council to prayerful discernment and listening has been well received in the Diocese and those interested are eager to be heard and to make submissions.

Key Issues and Responses to the Primary Question. These have been divided into 15 themes.

Liturgical Jottings Season of Lent I

Distribution of ashes in Lent originated from Gallican (French) and Mozarabic (Spanish) traditions and connected with the order of penitents. It came popular as many of the penitential practices once reserved for serious public sinners became standard for all Christians. Pope Urban II in 1091 ordered the imposition of ashes on the heads of all the faithful. The day became known as Ash Wednesday and preceded the First Sunday of Lent. Thus, for a time, the primary focus of Lent shifted from baptismal preparation to a penitential one.

Prayer for the Week

Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of selfrestraint. Ash Wednesday Collect Prayer (cf Ephesians 6:12-14)

Looking at the Readings

The Gospel Acclamation for today is from Matthew 4:4 (cf. Luke 4:4): "No one Lives on bread alone,

but on every word that comes from the mouth of God"

is Jesus' response to the first temptation. Each First Sunday of Lent we read an account of "The Temptations of Christ" from the three Gospels. Each record the experience of Christ in the wilderness, though Mark's account lacks the three temptations and Luke includes some variations.

Today's Gospel text from Luke notes that Jesus was not just led by the Spirit but also filled with the Holy Spirit. After the foiled temptations the Devil left but with a warning that he will return. Yet, the devil is foiled again by the victory of the Cross.

Later in the same chapter, Jesus begins his public ministry, again "filled with the Spirit" (4:14). The presence and the power of the Holy Spirit in the life of Jesus should strike a chord with us. Though we may not be tempted in the three ways that Christ was tempted, we do struggle with temptations, the pain and suffering of the world and questions and doubts about our faith.

"God is with me when I am in trouble", (Responsorial Psalm); "for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved", (Second Reading); and indeed we are fed by the Word of God for the journey ahead of us this Lenten Season. On a practical level Lent is a time of penance, repentance and preparation but on a deeper level Lent is a time of conversion and commitment to God through personal prayer, works of charity and communal celebrations.

Lenten Quote from the Saints

Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial. No one knows himself except through trial, or receives a crown except after victory, or strives except against an enemy or temptations. *St Augustine, commentary on the Psalm 60.*
