Liturgical Jottings Eucharistic Prayer part 12

Theology

The Eucharistic Prayer is the centre and high point of the entire celebration of the Mass. It is the prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification. The Priest calls upon the people to lift up their hearts towards the Lord in prayer and thanksgiving; he associates the people with himself in the Prayer that he addresses in the name of the entire community to God the Father through The congregation of the faithful joins with Christ in confessing the great deeds of God and in the offering of Sacrifice. **GIRM 78.**

The prayer acknowledges in praise and thanksgiving God's work of our salvation. It is also a prayer of remembrance of God's work in Jesus Christ that continues still. It is a prayer of offering which joins the assembly offering with Christ's offering of his own body and blood. It is also a prayer of supplication, reconciliation and sanctification.

Looking at the Gospel

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus identifies Himself not only with the kingshepherd, but also with the lost sheep, we can speak of a double identity: the king-shepherd, and also Jesus and the sheep: that is, He identifies Himself with the least and most in need of His brothers and sisters. And He thus indicates the criterion of the judgement: it will be made on the basis of concrete love given or denied to these persons, because He Himself, the judge, is present in each one of them. He is the judge. He is God and Man, but He is also the poor one, He is hidden and present in the person of the poor people that He mentions: right there. Jesus says: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it (or did it not) to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it (you did it not) to me" (vv. 40, 45). We will be judged on love.

The judgement will be on love, not on feelings, no: we will be judged on works, on compassion that becomes nearness and kind help. Have I drawn near to Jesus present in the persons of the sick, the poor, the suffering, the imprisoned, of those who are hungry and thirsty for justice? Do I draw near to Jesus present there? This is the question for today. *Pope Francis, The Angelus 2020*

Feast of Christ the King

It is necessary to insist on what Christ the King is not. He is not a political, military, economic ruler, a sports or pop star. This feast was moved from the last Sunday in October to the last Sunday of the liturgical year, which it crowns. It is not just the title of Christ that is the object of the celebration but his person and the global mystery of the Risen One at the right hand of the Father, who came, who comes, and who will come again.

Catholic Diocese of Sandhurst Theology Scholarships: Semester 1 2024

Designed to support the mission formation of parishioners through formal theological studies, especially those with or who are seeking pastoral leadership roles in the diocese of Sandhurst. Are you interested in studying theology or spiritual leadership in 2024?

- Scholarships are available for Sandhurst parishioners to study online post-graduate courses in theology at Catholic Theological College, Melbourne
- 50% of the tuition fees will be reimbursed (full cost: credit \$2,882, audit \$650).
- You may study for credit towards a Master's degree/Graduate certificate/Graduate diploma or for audit.
- If you have not studied at a tertiary level before you can take advantage of the "Professional Attainment" pathway.
- Scholarships are also available for the yearlong *Damascus Spiritual Leaders Program* at Heart of Life, Melbourne (50% of full cost reimbursed: full cost \$9,816 with tertiary credit). (According to the Heart of Life website the program is closed, however positions are still available for parishioners in the Sandhurst diocese.)
