Liturgical Jottings

Liturgy and Personality The Constitution on the Liturgy states: "All the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy (art 14). The people gathered for the liturgical celebrations of Mass, Sacraments and other rites are individuals but at the same time a community of believers. One but Many. Some prayers begin with "I confess ...", "I believe ...", "I am not worthy", and in the baptism rite parents and godparent answer: "I am" and "I do". Yet while in the singular all are united together to confess and to proclaim their faith. Other prayers include: ""We praise you, we bless you ...", "We offer you fruit of the earth", "We lift [our hearts] up to the Lord" "We proclaim your death". You and I, and We are many persons but one people to come to worship our God together in peace and unity.

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Focus on the Gospel

Jesus chose disciples to continue his work; he instructed them and empowered them. He sent them out on a mission, and they returned. People followed them, because they wanted to hear what Jesus and the disciples had to say; they wanted to be released from the sickness and the demons that possessed them.

There are so many searching people in the world today, people hungering for instruction, good people looking for direction. They may be parents who are sick with grief over the future of a troubled child; a man stripped of his dignity through unemployment; a woman facing a pregnancy alone; elderly people feeling the surge of life leave their declining bodies; people who are angry and confused because they believe that the church is no longer dependable. They are people who are looking for answers and for meaning. They are like sheep without a shepherd, and Jesus looks to us to shepherd them.

In the midst of this confusion, there are reliable shepherds who walk with us in the dark valleys. They are willing to share the dangers through which we pass, even at the risk of their own safety. They do not pit one segment of the community or one theological perspective against another, scattering the sheep and driving them away. Instead, they work to dismantle the walls that divide us. They speak the word that gathers us together. They reconcile us with God and with each other. They may not give us easy answers, but their primary concern is to lead us to Jesus, the one who is our peace. © Dianne Bergant CSA.

The readings highlight themes of shepherding, unity, guidance, and peace.


