They all ate.....

When the disciples told Jesus about the hungry crowd, Jesus said, "Give them something to eat yourselves!" Was he letting them know that they had more resources and ability than they knew? Jesus empowered his disciples to be channels of God's compassion and healing. This message of empowerment was not meant only for the disciples on that Palestinian hillside of many years ago; it's for us as well. Perhaps God wants us to be aware that we too have the means to ease some of the pain caused by hunger and poverty in the world we live in. We have the God-given power to do so much more good than we know. The disciples we read about here insisted that they could not pull this off. After all, they only had a few loaves and a few fish. How often do we respond in much the same way when God calls us? We do not believe we can make much of a difference, so we say a prayer for the hungry and let it go at that. *But it is in doing something that our prayer is complete.* Could we consider the amount of time we spend surfing the web or sitting in front of the TV and use some of that time instead to educate ourselves on the extent of hunger and poverty. There are a number of things we can do to make a difference. What about making hunger a family dinner table discussion? The same God who worked miracles through Jesus can work through us if we are willing to open our baskets — and our hearts; then with God's help, we can do as Jesus told his disciples to do. We can feed them ourselves.

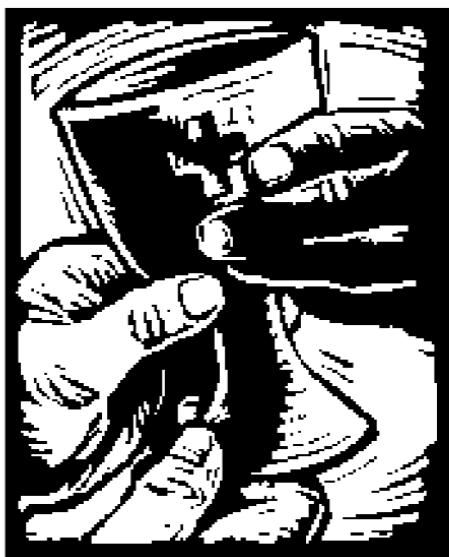

Prayer for the week

Looking at the Readings

The Middle Ages was a time of great theological debate. Especially explored was what happened to the bread and wine at the time of consecration. Just how did it become the Body and Blood of Christ. St Thomas Aquinas (1225-74) used the philosophy of the ancient Greek scholar Aristotle to eventually develop the theology of "Transubstantiation" that what the bread and wine was made of never changed, it would always be flour and grapes, but we as Catholic Christians believe that the essence or "substance" of the host is now the real presence of Christ. He comes in a special way to us via this bread and wine.

The larger Christian church still argue this very thing. It is what separates various Christian faiths from one another. It is why our communion table is still divided. But ultimately, like last week's theology of the Trinity, the theology of the Body and Blood is mystery. Another of those tricky mysteries of our faith that just calls us to believe without knowing. Sometimes as humans we want to be able to explain everything. But to do this we may lose the essence of our faith. Faith that God knows what is going on, and we trust in that knowledge.

I have faith that Jesus Christ is present in the bread and wine, and also in the Word of God, the Assembly and the Person who leads us in prayer. The Body and Blood of Christ is an article of faith. I have faith that God appears in many forms. The Trinity is an article of faith. I don't pretend to understand them, but I do believe them.

We stand every week and profess our faith, what we believe in, in our creed each week. These are our articles of faith. And that is what God asks of us. *To just have a little faith.*

Feast of the Week Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday 7 June

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus dates back to the 11th Century. The feast is tied to the devotion of the five wounds of Jesus. This Feast day was instigated in the 17th Century always falls 19 days after Pentecost. Our Diocesan Cathedral is named in honour of the Sacred Heart. The solemnity brings prayers for special blessings for priestly ordination.
