Saint of the Week – St Stanislaus, bishop and martyr (Friday, April 11)



Stanislaus was born of noble parents on July 26 near Krakow, Poland. He was educated at Gnesen and was ordained there. He became noted for his preaching and a much sought after spiritual adviser. When Stanislaus excommunicated King Boleslaus and stopped services at the Cathedral when Boleslaus entered, Boleslaus himself killed Stanislaus while the Bishop was saying Mass in a chapel outside the city on April 11 (now his feast day). He was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1253 and is the principle patron of Cracow.

At the Fraction Rite the priest breaks the Bread and puts a piece of the host into the Chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the Body of Jesus Christ, living and glorious. Looking at the Readings

Unbind him and let him go free... Jn 11:45

Lazarus is one of Jesus' very good friends; he and his sisters, Martha and Mary, welcome Jesus into their house often. Jesus goes to the place that is probably closest to home for him, a place where his friends live, a place where the people he knows love God as he does. Jesus is so comfortable with them that he knows they will understand his delay in coming to Lazarus' help when he is sick. He knows that all three will be waiting for him when he arrives. Jesus chooses Martha to reveal his greatness, to reveal that he is the Son of God (something that the apostles just do not come to begin to understand until after the resurrection).

Jesus performs here the miracle (the resuscitation of Lazarus) that will really send the authorities into meltdown. There is no turning back for Jesus now, and so he chooses to surround himself with his best friends, when he will need them most. Jesus is loved by these people, not because of any one thing he can do, but because of the person he is.

Lazarus is made free, he is let go, he is unbound, because of the action of Jesus. And Jesus' action is performed out of love and a desire for God's glory to be seen.

Lent calls us to reflect on why we do the things we do. Are our actions towards others performed out of love? Do we reflect the glory of God in the things we do? Do our actions release people, or bind them more tightly with obligations, guilt or anger?

Do we unbind people and let them go free?
