Today's readings spell out the significance of the sending of the Holy Spirit, the fulfilment of Jesus' death and resurrection, for the early church - and for us today!

The Gospel of John tells us that after Jesus' death the disciples were so afraid of the authorities that they hid themselves in a locked room. Despite the locked doors Jesus appeared to them; he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." The Spirit transformed them. They began preaching fearlessly.

The Acts of the Apostles describes a further miracle accompanying this preaching. Many pilgrims all speaking different languages had come to Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost. All were able to understand the disciples. The Spirit transformed the preachers and the listeners! *This is a sign of the creation of true community centred in Jesus Christ. Because the gospel can be proclaimed in all languages, the Church, the body of Christ, can be sustained and grow.*

And Corinthians reminds us that these gifts of the Spirit were not limited to the original disciples and their hearers but were given to everyone. Further these gifts of the Spirit become the source of God's power enlivening every part of the community for as Paul exclaims "we were all given to drink of one Spirit." Through the Spirit's presence we are, in Paul's words, a "new creation" and "temples of the Spirit." So we the Christian community, brought into being and held together by the Spirit are to continue to do God's work our world.

Pentecost Sunday invites us to recognise and celebrate the Spirit of the risen Christ moving among us to break down the barriers that divide people of different race, language, gender and economic conditions. Come Holy Spirit.

**Feast Day of the Week – St Joseph the
Hymnographer (June 14)**

St Joseph was born in Sicily in 830, but had to flee his homeland due to an Arab invasion. He entered the monastery of Studium in Constantinople but was again forced to flee persecution. He was on his way to Rome, after being exiled, when he was kidnapped by pirates and made a slave in Crete. While enslaved, Joseph continued to show his love and devotion to his fellow slaves by converting some of them to Christianity.

After escaping captivity, he returned to Constantinople and established a monastery. He was once again banished when he spoke out against the iconoclast emperor, Theophilus. He is now recognised as one of the greatest poets and hymnists of the Byzantine Church, composing more than 1000 works.

Sister Monica Glass CSN died in Western Australia on the 19th May 2014. Sister Monica, the daughter of Tess and Joe Glass grew up in Allans Flat (Beechworth Parish), and attended Delaney College Beechworth and Aquinas Teachers College Ballarat before entering the Congregation of the Sisters of Nazareth. Sister Monica was on staff at St Lawrence's School, Bluff Point WA. Her Funeral Mass was celebrated in Geraldton WA.

On Saturday 14th June at 11.00am, a Memorial Mass will be celebrated in St Matthews Church Yackandandah. The Memorial Mass will provide an opportunity for her extended family and many good friends to pray for her, to prayerfully remember her, give thanks for the many blessings God bestowed on her in this life, and to offer support to her family members and religious sisters.

Liturgical Jottings

Pentecost was originally a Jewish harvest festival celebrated 50 days after Passover. Many pilgrims would come to Jerusalem for this festival. It was on this day that the Spirit was manifested in the lives of the disciples. The Christian feast of Pentecost is 50 days after Easter and is the completion of the Lent-Easter cycle.

Joy of the Gospel

Joy was felt by the first converts who marvelled to hear the apostles preaching "in the native language of each" (Acts 2:6) on the day of Pentecost. This joy is a sign that the Gospel has been proclaimed and is bearing fruit. Yet the drive to go forth and give, to go out from ourselves, to keep pressing forward in our sowing of the good seed, remains ever present.

Looking at the Readings

The frightened disciples are gathered in the upper room. Jesus appears to them and commissions them to preach, teach, heal, prophecy and renew the world. Jesus breathes on them and transforms their lives. Interestingly, there 120 people in the upper room (Acts 1:15)

The Hebrew word for breath, *ruah*, means the life force given to humans, the spirit. When John talks about sin he is not thinking of a list of sins or some new sin but the forces of evil. Jesus gives the disciples, and us, the power, the force, the spirit to overcome evil!

Red is the colour often associated with the Spirit and red vestments are worn. Red symbolises the intense love or 'fire' of the Holy Spirit. Other Symbols of the Spirit, tongues of fire, wind, white dove, all have their origin in Scripture; each contains something of the mystery of the Spirit of God which is beyond human understanding.

The Church teaches that the Holy Spirit brings both gifts and fruits to the faithful. There are seven gifts: wisdom, understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, awe of the Lord (CCC n1831). The twelve fruits are charity (love), joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control and chastity (CCC n1832).

How do you see the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit manifest in your life and in our community?
