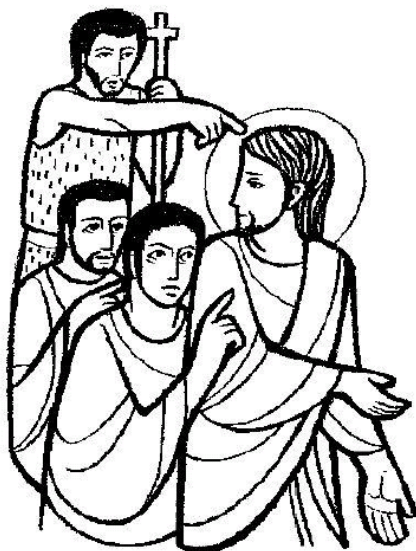

Liturgical Jottings

The entrance procession

When the people are gathered, the Entrance Song begins and the ministers and Priest enter. Its purpose is to open the celebration, and foster the unity of those who have been gathered. They process in this order: the thurifer, if incense is used, servers with candles and between them one with the cross; reader, who may carry the book of the Gospels, lay ministers of Holy Communion and the Priest. When they reach the altar, the Priest and ministers bow. The cross is placed next to the altar. It is a praiseworthy practice for the book of the Gospels to be placed on the altar.

Prayer for the week

Focus on the Readings

Jesus' invitation to 'Come and See' is a powerful image in this week's gospel. It is not a simple reply to the question of where Jesus is living; in some ways it is a summary of his whole ministry – come and see what I am on about and become part of it. It is typical of the invitational nature of Jesus' ministry. Throughout the gospels, Jesus offers and invites, he does not force his ministry onto anyone. When he invites us to 'Come and See' it is an invitation to 'give it a go'; take a chance; let go of what we know.

To 'Come and See' is exactly what Jesus invited the apostles to do. In this week's reading, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, takes up the invitation and becomes a follower of Jesus. He is so impressed with what he sees in Jesus that he finds his brother and tells him that they've found the Messiah and that Simon should come and join them. Jesus immediately gives Simon a new nickname: the Rock (Peter). In this instance, Simon is becoming a disciple of Jesus, a trusted and influential one at that.

Unlike the call of Samuel in today's first reading, in which the call to discipleship is heard as a booming voice, Andrew and Simon experience the call through personal encounter with Jesus. A booming voice from the sky might be helpful, but for most of us the call comes in much more subtle ways through our prayer, reflection and interaction with others.

St Francis de Sales

Feast of the Week: St Francis de Sales 24 January

Born in 1567, Savoy, he gained a doctorate in law but his real love was theology and his heart set on devoting his life to God. He was ordained and preached and taught strenuously winning many back to the Church. He became bishop of Geneva and renowned in spirituality and his works: "Introduction to the Devout Life" and "A Treatise on the Love of God". He also wrote many pamphlets and letters earning the title patron of journalists.

On the Lighter Side
