General Instruction of the Roman Missal #105b

Year of Consecrated Life Faithful Companions of Jesus

This Society lives the Ignatian tradition providing education, spiritual direction and assistance to those in any kind of need. Their missionary spirit adapts to the immediate needs the society and culture in which they live. Founded 1820 by Marie Madeleine in France they have spread worldwide serving education, the poor and the spiritual needs of all who ask.

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Focus on the Gospel

The early Christian Church decorated the wall of their new churches with mosaics, showing Christ eating with the twelve and not bread and wine on the table but bread and fish on the table in front of them. This represented what the early church thought Eucharist was all about. I think that the feeding of the 5000 has much Eucharistic in its message.

Here Jesus tells the stories of His Father and speaks of the generosity of God before he displays that graciousness. Jesus feeds people without knowing anything about them. He did not care whether the people gathered in front of Him were married or single, male or female, who they lived with, how many children they had or even what their faith was. He fed everyone.

Jesus fed using the food of the common people, bread and fish.

This is one of the two miracles that Jesus performs without anybody asking Him to. Jesus sees a need and provides what is needed. In fact, he provides more than is ever needed, twelve baskets more.

If we transfer this generosity of Jesus to our table here in our community, then all people, regardless of age, sex, belief or colour are welcome at our table. Welcome to hear the message of Jesus. Everyone will be given equally without asking, and given more than can ever be needed.

That ideal of a generous and gracious God reflected by the people who gather here is a wonderful gift.

Throughout the gospels Jesus often eats with people, he shares their hospitality. Hospitality is something that Jesus asks of those on earth who he shared his journey with, and of everyone today. For the hospitality we show here on earth to Jesus, in this community will surely be gifted back to us in the next Kingdom where God's hospitality will be on display. The feeding of the 5000 will be reflected again for everyone in the Kingdom of God, where all will be fed and welcomed in abundance.
