CATHOLIC SCHOOL PARENTS COVER ALMOST ONE-THIRD OF EDUCATION COSTS

Did you know that parents of students in Catholic schools continue to pay almost 30 per cent of the cost of educating their child, on average, despite increases in government funding to meet the changing educational needs of students in Catholic schools.

School funding data shows that the share of recurrent funding that Catholic school parents pay has been consistent in recent years at 29 per cent.

On average, a student in a Catholic school receives \$2,000 less in government funding than a government school student.

"PARISH RESPONSE TO URGENT SOCIAL ISSUE

The Goulburn Valley has a huge issue with the abuse of drugs and ICE. The levels of domestic violence as a result are well above the State average. The Parish Pastoral Council at Mooroopna sees an urgent need to raise awareness and seek to address this critical issue. Families especially with children at our schools need to be aware of the prevalence of this social scourge.

The public Forum that has been arranged will address the issue. Jenny O'Connell is an experienced and well known counsellor. She will speak about a new method of counselling which seeks to assist people affected by this scourge. A parent will tell the story of a family coping with the issue. Then a senior police officer will speak about the extent of the problem in the Goulburn Valley and the North East of Victoria.

The hope is that service clubs, sports clubs and the local aboriginal community will take advantage of this opportunity. An invitation is extended to parents from our schools and the broader community to attend."

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Looking at the Readings

Easter is a time when we look at the faith we call our own and we hear the story of its beginnings, from humble, ordinary people who tried to be faithful but did not always get it right. We are part of a 2000-year history of trying to get our faith right. A history of grand attempts and marvellous failures. Ours is a 2000-year history of fallible people, trying their best.

How we act out our love of God is varied. Many of the people who are firing guns in the lands of Israel and Palestine do so because they believe they are defending a land given them by God. It is in God's name that they strap explosives to their bodies and head to the shopping centres. Extremists in faith – certainly; followers of God – apparently; lovers of people – doubtful.

I think Jesus wants more than our blind devotion. He died on a cross not so we would judge others, and disregard the needs of those who call out for help, but He died so that we would know what it is to love the "other". We need to be willing to stand behind our faith, but we need to question what we see as wrong, we have a right to justice, but not to vengeance; we need to forgive, we need to accept others in their need, and we need to talk to Jesus in prayer all the time. Because without the constant conversation with Jesus much of what we see in our world, and our country simply does not make sense. Even with prayer some things are just a mystery, but Jesus invites us to "Trust in God still, and trust in me". Sometimes that is all we as Christians can do. Trust in God.

In this week to come, spare a thought and a prayer for those who around our world struggle with their following of God, spare a prayer for the fallible, the lost, the forsaken, the unforgiven, and the ones that seem to just get it wrong. Spare a prayer that we will be patient, understanding, forgiving. Maybe just spare a prayer for someone else, because we all need it.

Memorable Memorial of the Week

St Stanislaus – Monday 11 April

Stanislaus was born of noble parents on 26 July 1030 at Szczepanow near Cracow, Poland. He was ordained a priest at Gnesen and then a Bishop. He was a great preacher, and became well-known for the wisdom he gave out in his sermons.

Today will never come again. Be a blessing. Be a friend. Encourage someone.
Take time to care. Let your words heal, and not wound.
