Looking at the Readings

We hear in today's gospel that Simon the Pharisee invited Jesus to dine with him and while they were at table a woman who had a bad name in the town, entered, bringing with her an alabaster jar of ointment. She stood near to Jesus, weeping, and when her tears fell on his feet, she wiped them away with her hair; then she covered his feet with kisses and anointed them with the ointment. The intervention was an astounding event in that time, place and gathering, and the acceptance Jesus showed was shocking to Simon his host who felt that if Jesus were a prophet, he would know the reputation of this woman and have nothing to do with her. Just as Simon was reflecting on this within himself, Jesus tells a short parable to make plain that he does indeed know what sort of woman she is, and more than that, he knows what sort of person his host is as well.

The parable Jesus told noted that those who had a greater debt forgiven would love more than those forgiven a lesser debt. He then applied this story to the welcome he was given on his arrival and the contrasting behaviours towards him by the woman and by Simon. Elsewhere in Luke's gospel (5:32), we hear the words of Jesus: "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." What had happened for the woman in her discovery of the great grace of God was more important to Jesus than whatever judgement might be made upon himself.

The woman loved Jesus because she had been forgiven much. We, too, are forgiven much and so we are graced to love much. We are already beloved of God from the very first moment of our existence. If we ever realised the great unconditional love of God for us, we could not help but love God. Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy'. ('Misericordiae Vultus'). How do we show our love? All God wants of us is that our love for him be shown through the way we live for him every day.
