FR MICK FITZPATRICK RIP

Fr Mick died in St John of God Hospital in Geelong last Tuesday, 28th June. He was a priest of the Archdiocese of Melbourne for 57 years and aged 83 years.

He was, for many years, the Director of Vocations in Melbourne. He helped many men in their discernment of a priestly vocation. His gentle manner and caring nature were beautiful gifts he was given.

Most of you didn't know of him but he was an enormous help to me when I was discerning whether I would be accepted for the priesthood by which diocese or would I join the MSC (the Sacred Heart Fathers). He didn't try and sway me to join Melbourne. He just quietly helped me on my journey. So he has helped me to be a priest amongst you and for you today. So I ask you to pray for him and to thank God for the many priests he has helped.

Liturgical Jottings Ministries at Mass

The Choir: Among the faithful, the *schola* or choir exercises its own liturgical function, to take care that the parts proper to it, in keeping with the different genres of chant, are properly carried out and to foster the active participation of the faithful by means of the singing. (GIRM 103)

Amoris Laetitia

Love is not boastful: The inner logic of Christian love is not about importance and power; rather, "whoever would be first among you must be your slave" (Mt 20:27). In family life, the logic of domination and competition about who is the most intelligent or powerful destroys love. St Peter's words also applies to the family: "Clothe yourselves with humility towards one another, for 'God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble'" (1 Pet 5:5). (para 98. Pope Francis)

Looking at the Readings

The first thing that is striking about this gospel passage is the fact that there are 72 disciples whom Jesus sends out on mission. We can have an image of Jesus strolling around Galilee with just a small group of followers but this passage makes it clear that a significant number of people were engaged in his ministry. And the gospel writer has not just made an error in naming 72 rather than the Twelve because just one chapter earlier the Twelve were sent out. This sending out to mission is a significant element of the gospel of Luke. The first sending of the Twelve represents the mission to the Jews – the 12 tribes of Israel are frequently used symbolically to represent all of the Jewish people. The sending of the 72 then represents the mission beyond the Jewish people to all nations and all people.

Another theme that is significant in the gospel of Luke is the message of hospitality. Jesus teaches on it frequently and tries to convey a message that the hospitality of God is available to all. In the sending of both the Twelve and the 72, Jesus tells them to take nothing with them for the journey. He is telling them to rely on the hospitality of strangers. If they are welcomed and shown hospitality then they are to bless the household and carry out their ministry. The ability to show hospitality to the messengers of God is a sign that the household will welcome the message of God. However, wherever they do not receive hospitality they are to leave the town, shaking the dust from their feet, as their ministry will not be welcomed by people who are not ready to hear it. It is an excellent message about not wasting your efforts in unproductive ways – not hitting your head against a brick wall!
