### PRIESTS IN-SERVICE REFLECTIONS

We gathered at the Seminary in Carlton on Monday last week. I was fortunate enough to be given one of the new rooms that have been built for accommodation for students. (We were asked to donate to their construction some twelve months ago.) We had a good gathering of priests, about thirty managed to make it. When you see us together it is interesting to note that nearly half of the number are priests from overseas – India or the Philippines.

The first day was all about our 'well-being' and how do we manage our lives, our work, our health and so on, all very helpful.

The next day, Wednesday, was presented by the Catholic Education Office. This was all about what we, as a diocese, and as parishes are required to do by law now, in creating a child safe environment. This is to be implemented by January 2017. Our schools have just completed their requirements. This will involve a lot of work by willing parishioners to put this in place and by January.

Our third day was presented by Dr David Collins who is a Doctor of Clinical Psychology. He was speaking about the brain and what things impact on the brain, how the brain works, behavioural patterns etc. I found the sessions fascinating and he was a great presenter.

### FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Firstly and most importantly – thank you all for your generosity with our Planned Giving program. Our giving is 97% of our pledged amount which is absolutely amazing. The consistency of giving allows us to undertake maintenance projects with confidence.

We have been progressing through our maintenance agenda for a considerable time now.

**Some of the major tasks have been completed. These are as follows:**

- Painting of the exterior of the Church \$22,000
- Plumbing works at the Parish Hall -\$9,200 (this was to prevent rising damp, stop the cracking of the exterior walls, and to stop the cracking of the internal walls.
- Some renovation of the toilet block at the hall

### Projects to be completed:

- Painting the interior of the Parish Hall
- Repairs/replacement of the floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen
- Do some painting patch up to the interior of the Church where the old heaters were located and behind the new hand basin in the Sacristy.

As you can see we have had some major expenditure and we thank you for all you have contributed towards our maintenance program.

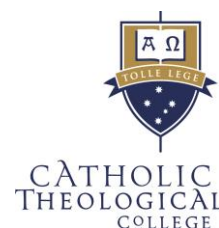

## Liturgical Jottings

### The Rosary – Part 2

The Joyful Mysteries – These are traditionally said on Monday and Saturday. As you are meditating on each mystery, read the Scripture passage, then as you are saying the Hail Mary's meditate on becoming part of the story of each mystery. Hear God talking to you.

- *The Annunciation:* The Archangel Gabriel "announces" to Mary that she shall conceive the Son of God. Luke 1:26-38; John 1:14
- *The Visitation:* Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist. Luke 1:39-56
- *The Nativity:* Jesus is born. Luke 2:6-20; Matthew 1:18-25
- *The Presentation:* Mary and Joseph "present" Jesus in the Temple where they meet Simeon. Luke 2:22-39
- *The Finding in the Temple:* After losing Him, Mary and Joseph find young Jesus teaching the Rabbis in the Temple. Luke 2:41-51

## Looking at the Readings

It seems that no one has returned to give thanks to God except this foreigner.

This is taken from Luke Chapter 17 where Jesus is travelling along the border between Samaria and Galilee. He has pity on ten lepers and heals them. As his journey to Jerusalem enters its final stages, Jesus continues to instruct his disciples on various topics turning aside to engage opponents as well as heal the sick and restore them to society.

This journey to Jerusalem starts with the disciples wanting to call down fire on a Samaritan village that had been inhospitable. Later, in one of the parables a despised Samaritan had been the model of a true neighbour. In this story the Samaritan is the model of faith.

The ten lepers were presumably nine Jews and one Samaritan. This mixed group, usually bitter enemies, are uncommonly equals because of their illness. They are forced to depend on one another. Leprosy was seen as a punishment for sin, therefore lepers were both moral and physical outcasts. As they are healed the Samaritan is no longer welcome to be part of the group. He can't go to the priest in the Temple because he is forbidden to enter the Temple. Instead he returns to Jesus and praises God for what Jesus has done. He becomes a disciple of Jesus.

This week, reach out to someone who is marginalised in your community. Spend some time with them, listen to them and share a meal with them.

## Feast of the Week Tuesday 11 October

St John XXIII (1881-1963), a priest, bishop and cardinal, a student, pastor and diplomat, and as pope he called the Second Vatican Council with two pastoral aims: *aggiornamento* (refreshing the church) and *ressourcement* (returning to the sources).
